<u>ENGINEER'S REPORT:</u> #1 Email to Tricia Groff of Emerald Equipment Systems, Inc. from Robert Smith of Remington, Vernick & Walberg notifying her that the back of the screen box is still missing and that an additional cost was incurred when the old screen had to be temporarily hooked up while the issues with the new screen were being worked out. A copy of the invoice for the electrical connection to the old screen in the amount of \$1,865.96 was provided to Ms. Groff and we are awaiting for a reply as to whether the cost should be deducted from the invoice prior to remitting payment.

The County is requiring comments from the BBMUA Solicitor on the road opening permit and bond requirement and is requesting they call and speak with the County attorney Tony Pagano to discuss the matter.

**#7** Email from Robert Smith of Remington, Vernick & Walberg to Lisa Myers of AC Schultes updating Mr. Smith on the status of the items required to complete the project for the Service of Well No. 3.

<u>SOLICITOR'S REPORT</u>: #8 Email from Robert Casella of Testa, Heck, Testa & White in reference to the High Occupancy Permit for the Louis Drive Sanitary Sewer Extension Project. Mr. Casella spoke with the attorney for the County. He understands the impossibility to obtain a five year bonding for this type of permit. Mr. Pagano indicated they can accept a three year bond with years four and five being evaluated at that time and will send acceptable wording to include in a contract modification with Jersey Construction. As the Solicitors are proceeding to remedy this matter, Mr. Pagano will recommend that the permit be issued conditioned upon the modification and bond to be provided thereafter.
