A conference call was held on Monday, November 24, 2014 with Michael Testa, Robert Smith, Steve Testa and Cheryl Santore to discuss the letter of support requested by Solis Partners to accompany the NJBPU Renewable Energy Incentive Program grant application. After much research and conversations with another local utilities authority that has been working with Mr. Curtin of Solis Partners it was decided that a letter of support will not be provided by the BBMUA. Also the information will not be forwarded to the school to provide a letter on their behalf either. The reason being is that per NJ Public Contracts Law this project would have to go out for bid for a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA). All of the professionals do not feel comfortable providing a letter of intent prior to bidding. In order for the school to provide a letter of intent there has to be a lease established with Solis Partners for the portion of the Donato Property and in order to lease part of that property it would have to be placed out for public bid per the NJ Public Contracts Law as well. Since this cannot be accomplished by the deadline to file the application of December 7, 2014 with the BPU there will be no letters drafted at this time. Mr. Curtin was informed that he could file for the funding on his own without the support letters and he stated that was not possible because a project had to be specified in order to apply. This matter can be discussed further with the professionals at the next meeting if so desired.
